Re: Legislative Update – 2014 House of Origin Deadline

Friday, May 30 was the “House of Origin” deadline which means that all bills introduced in their respective house must have passed to the other house in order for the bill to remain active and continue to move through the legislative process. Both houses of the Legislature took action on hundreds of bills last week.

Below is a list of bills that met this deadline and continue to move through the Legislature. Now that this deadline has passed, both houses will resume policy committees and begin taking up bills from the other house.
