Re: Legislative Update

On Thursday, July 3, at the conclusion of legislative business, the Assembly and Senate will recess for summer break and return on Monday, August 4. No committees or floor sessions will occur during this time. Upon the Legislature's return, they will be hearing and taking up bills leading up to the deadline for fiscal committees to hear all bills. The Legislature has until Monday, August 31 to pass all bills to the Governor for the 2014 legislative session.

Below is a list of bills that continue to move through the Legislature and will be taken up in committee upon the Legislature's return from summer recess. Please don't hesitate to contact us with any questions or concerns.
