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Re: Legislative Update: End of Session Update

The Legislature adjourned at 3:03 am on Saturday, August 30, one day earlier than the August 31 constitutional deadline. The Governor has until Tuesday, September 30 to sign or veto all legislation on his desk. The Legislature is now in recess until final adjournment sine die at midnight on Sunday, November 30, although their work will largely begin in earnest next year. Below is a list of bills that have passed the Legislature and are now on the Governor's desk as well as those that have already been signed into law.

We want to extend our thanks and appreciation to the Executive Board for their time and effort working on the issues noted below. We will continue to keep you updated as actions are taken by the Governor. It is our continued honor to work with CLEARS and represent you in the halls of the Capitol.

Provides for eligibility for funding and priority for funding to programs that have demonstrated effectiveness in child sexual abuse or commercial exploitation intervention.
